97535 – Self-Care/Home Management	Application of trick to ADLs/IADLs.
	Sample: "Client practiced Linking Paper
	Clips to support dexterity for managing
	fasteners."
92507 – Speech/Language Therapy	Expressive communication, sequencing,
	pragmatic language.
	Sample: "Client described Vanishing
	Cotton Swab steps to enhance expressive
	language."
